Strokes that are attributed to atrial fib are more damaging, and they have more implications so if having atrial fib, and again I just went to the doctor and had it rechecked, nothing showed up, but I'm at higher risk for having a stroke. And working in the stroke world, I see what can happen. And again, atrial fib strokes are more devastating than some of the other strokes. Well, I am on medication.

I have lived with Atrial Fib for 28 years. And I have a full life. I love my life. I love the job that I do. So you can live a normal life.

But the most important thing to remember is to do anything you can to motivate yourself to stay healthy. It's very important. So take it seriously, but enjoy your life. It's very important for all of us, just to take care of our heart.

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
