I don't know if you can see it, but this is what she looked like the first day she was born.

The first response we got was that she had a two percent chance of making it, and then it was about 10 percent chance from every day after that first day.

I don't like to get emotional, but it was tough. The drive from County to over here at Loma Linda and the car ride alone, I would break down each time coming from the hospital to come here.

But those first few days, the first couple of weeks, you basically feel helpless. There's nothing really you can do but just sit there and watch. You can stick your finger out and she'll hold your finger, but there's not really anything else you can really do. You just hope she gets better.

But in a matter of less than three weeks, she's completely better. She's lost a ton of weight. She lost her fluid. The nurses have all been great. They have so much more here to offer her in order to help her get better. And I really think because she was here is why she was able to get better so quickly.
