

When to Call the Doctor? NSAIDS

You take Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs or NSAIDS to relieve your aches, pains and fever. If you experience serious side effects while taking NSAIDS, here are some guidelines on when to call the doctor.

1. Call your doctor if you have bloody urine or stools or stools that are similar to coffee grounds.
2. Call your doctor if you have severe stomach pain.
3. Call your doctor if you have Jaundice, a yellowing of the skin or eyes.
4. Call your doctor if you have blurred vision.

If you experience shortness of breath, difficulty swallowing, swollen face, lips, tongue and/or throat, rapid heartbeat and chest pain or tightness, call 911 immediately.

It's important to follow your healthcare provider's instructions for taking NSAIDS.

Call your doctor when: You have bloody urine or stools or stools that are similar to coffee grounds. You have severe stomach pain. You have Jaundice. You have blurred vision. And call 911 if you have shortness of breath, difficulty swallowing, swollen face, lips, tongue and/or throat, rapid heartbeat and chest pain or tightness.
