

RSV Immunization for Babies and Toddlers

Protect your baby from RSV this cold season.

RSV stands for respiratory syncytial virus.

In infants and some toddlers, this common virus can be dangerous. It may even lead to a hospital stay.

RSV antibodies can help protect your child from severe RSV illness. An RSV shot may be recommended for: Infants under 8 months; And babies and toddlers 8 to 19 months who are at high risk of severe RSV.

Ask your child's healthcare provider if the shot is right for your baby or toddler this RSV season.
