

Definition: Immunotherapy

Immunotherapy is a type of cancer treatment.

It boosts your immune system to target and kill cancer cells. Healthy cells aren't targeted and usually aren't harmed.

You may get these medicines: Through an IV; From an injection; As a cream; by mouth as a pill; or instilled into the bladder.

Some examples of immunotherapy include: Medicines called monoclonal antibodies; CAR T-cell therapy; And cancer vaccines.
